Dean Doug's Musings WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE EASTER CELEBRATION?

Easter 2024 was glorious here at Bethel! The weather cooperated, and we could have our Sunrise Service outside. Inside the sanctuary was absolutely beautiful with tulips, hyacinths, and lilies

all in full bloom. Attendance was encouraging. People were smiling, greeting one another and enjoying being together. We saw a lot of new faces, who we hope to see in the Easter Season now. The music was joyous and very festive. And we had a terrific breakfast. The Spirit of the living Lord was everywhere. I hope the same was true for you as well.

But what happens in the weeks following Easter? Will the joy of the resurrection of Jesus Christ inspire us to renewed commitment to worship and service as "Resurrection People?"

An old friend and seminary professor, Art Arnold, shared this story that I cut out and now share with you.

A little boy was listening in on a family conversation. His parents were talking sympathetically about the Sunday School superintendent who has lost a beloved family member a few days before. They wondered if the superintendent would be in church school the next Sunday, which happened to be Easter.

The family went to church together, then little Johnny went to Sunday School. When it was over, the little boy came running up to his parents and said excitedly: "Mom, Dad! He really believes it." Mom and Dad tried to calm him down and figure out what he meant – and gradually they found out.

There in Sunday School, their son watched and listened as the superintendent presided at the opening gathering. With tears in his eyes, and an occasional lump in his throat, the superintendent read the Easter story, and said a few words about it. Johnny sensed it all: the sorrow, the struggle, the Easter faith. And the best of all was Jesus appearing again and again. He couldn't wait to tell his folks: "Mom, Dad! He really believes it!" "Through Christ you have come to trust in God. And you have placed you faith and hope in God because he raised Christ from the dead and gave him great glory." (I Peter 1:21)
